1. We are Capitol Records UK, a division of Universal Music Operations Limited a company registered in England and Wales at 4 Pancras Square, London, N1 4AG (“UMO”) who operate the Divorce online store at <https://shop.divorcehq.co.uk>.
2. To access the exclusive pre-sale window for tickets to the Divorce Rock City show (“Tour”), order ‘Drive to Goldenhammer’ in any format from the Divorce online store or submit your email address via the online form: <https://live.umusic.com/divorce-rock-city-npn> by 10am GMT on 13 March 2025. If you have already ordered from the store, you will receive a pre-sale code. UMO will not accept any pre-sale code submissions from the online form or store that are: automatically generated by computer, completed by third parties or in bulk, illegible, have been altered, reconstructed, forged or tampered with, photocopies and not originals, or incomplete. No purchase necessary. One pre-sale code per person.
3. The pre-sale code will give you access to buy Tour tickets in accordance with these terms. Your pre-sale code is only valid for the pre-sale window specified within these terms and is not applicable for any other dates that may be announced (if applicable). By redeeming or attempting to redeem your pre-sale code, you are deemed to have accepted these terms and conditions.

You will receive your unique pre-sale code via email by 3:30pm GMT on 13 March 2025 together with a link to the ticket provider’s website where you can redeem the pre-sale code to purchase tickets once the pre-sale window opens. We do not accept responsibility if the email we send to the email address you have provided does not reach you for any reason beyond our reasonable control, including where the email is flagged as spam. 7. The pre-sale code gives you access to the pre-sale only and it is not a guarantee that you will be able to buy tickets to the Tour. Ticket availability is limited and subject to currently available inventory. Tickets will be sold on a first-come, first-served basis while supplies last.
